

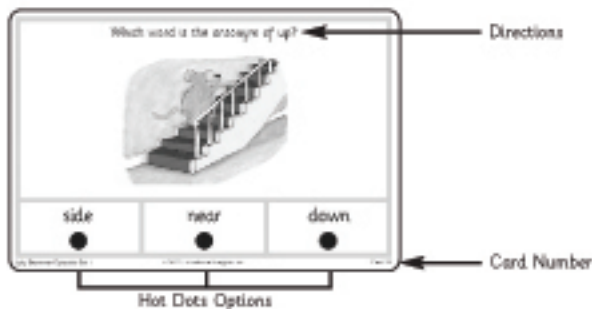

Use these Jolly Grammar cards with a Talking Hot Dots® Pen (sold separately) for independent literacy practice, or use the cards by themselves as traditional flash cards. Set One encompasses a range of topics covered by Jolly Grammar, including parts of speech, alphabet order, upper and lower-case letters, plurals and tenses.

### Using the cards with the Talking Hot Dots Pen

Independent practice is easy with Hot Dots Flash Cards and the Talking Hot Dots Pen. First, read the question. Then look at the answer options. Use the Talking Hot Dots Pen to select the right answer. The pen gives instant feedback. When a correct answer is selected, the pen lights up green and makes a fun, congratulatory sound. If an incorrect answer is selected, the pen lights up red and produces a gentle negative sound.

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# HOT DOTS

## How to use the Talking Hot Dots Pen

Demonstrate how to use the Talking Hot Dots Pen with the Hot Dots Flash Cards. Show how to position the pen on a Hot Dot answer choice. Make sure the tip of the pen touches the centre of the dot, and that it sits flat on the surface of the Hot Dot.

### Tips

- Do NOT laminate the cards. The Talking Pen cannot detect correct and incorrect answers when cards are laminated.
- Make sure the cards rest on a hard surface, such as a table top, when using the Talking Pen on them.

Hold up the card with the question facing the learner. Check answers on the included answer sheet.
